TITLE: National Youth Service Corps Participation in Green Belt Pilot Project in the Arid and Semi-Arid Regions of **Nigeria**

Brief description

Train 5,000 Climate Youth Corps from the National

Youth Service Corps of Nigeria to become community animators and climate champions in three states in (three local governments in each of the three states) Northern Nigeria. Youth Corps who receives training from

PACCPOLICY will partner the state forestry commissions who will provide the drought resistance and fast yielding seedlings which will be distribute to school children tasked (through train of trainer model) with planting seedlings at homes, schools, gardens and farms.



The aim is to recover the degraded lands to control droughts and soil erosions. The Project will liaise with gatekeepers (local chiefs) and other stakeholders to allocate land for community afforestation.

However, stakeholders' engagements will be key where cattle herdsman will be part of the stakeholders' engagement for smooth operation of the project. This will ensure participation, ownership and sustainability.

- 500 trained school children
- 5,000 copers trained.
