Re: Community for Climate Action North Etobicoke

Dear Community Member!

The Community for Climate Action North Etobicoke (CCAN) project is happening in your community this Spring! Hosted by the Africa Climate Action Initiative (ACAI), with support from the Rexdale Women's Centre and the City of Toronto, CCAN aims to share knowledge, resources and opportunities about how climate change is impacting our communities and how we can take action, as individuals and together.

Climate change is a serious challenge both globally and here in our City. According to TransformTO, Toronto's three major areas of harmful greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions are from buildings and energy use, transportation, and waste management. The City also found that 92% of Torontonians agree that climate change threatens personal health and well-being, and 78% are concerned about its impacts on our City. Yet nearly half do not know what they can do to address it. We believe change starts with knowledge, community, and partnership.
